

Redhawks Baseball Information for Workers

Redhawks Baseball concessions are under new management this year. A company called Centerplate. They are new to OKC so please be patient with them while they work out the kinks. We may work booths with other non-profit organizations for the first few games until all schedules are set.

We will earn \$45.00 per person or a 9.5% commission whichever is higher. We are required to have liability insurance. To make this happen 5% will be taken out of each night's earnings. At the end of summer, providing we fulfill our commitment to the Redhawks, we will get the 5% insurance money back.

Check in time is 2 – 2 1/2 hours before game time. The individual game start times will be on the sign-up sheets. Enter through the gate across from the Sonic Building (3rd base sideline). Sign in with guard, then proceed downstairs to get your stand supplies & cash. Remember to bring your photo ID card. Ladies, Try to not bring your purse, a fanny pack is preferred.

Chuck Hartley will be emailing names of workers to the Redhawks organization a week in advance. You must be identified on the gate list as either the manager (the person who takes care of the inventory) or the assistant (the person who takes care of the money).

Clothing: All workers must wear khaki pants or capri's. Tennis shoes are preferred. No open toed shoes or sandals are allowed. A Redhawks shirt will be provided and must be turned back in that evening. Hats and/or visors will be provided. You will take them home, but you must bring them back the next time you work. Each new worker will get their hat/visor when they work for the first time. You will have to sign for the hat/visor. If you forget to bring it with you the next time you work, you will have to pay \$4.00 for another one.

Employee food coupon books worth \$10.00 can be purchased at half price (\$5.00). It's a good deal.

Sale of beer is a two (2) beer maximum limit per sale per person. Card anyone who you think is under the age of 35. If you're not sure & they have no ID card, NO BEER! If someone hands a beer to a friend, you need to card that person as well. You can refuse to sell beer to a customer if you think they are intoxicated. However do not argue with them. Call a manager.
